All Eli ever knew was that he was named after his great Uncle Moshe, and that Moshe died in a motor accident in Cape Town, six weeks before his wedding.

Then a photograph given to him eighty years later changed everything!

This is the story of great Uncle Moshe and his fiancée Paula's ill-fated romance in the late 1920's, starting in Orla, Poland, and ending in Cape Town.

The photo was the start of Eli's intrepid detective work, which took him on the trail to South Africa, Poland, Belarus, the UK, Germany, Israel, USA, Canada and the Gitlin Library, in search of answers!
